

First Lesson: Acts 1:1–11 (all sit)

In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commandment through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. To them he presented himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days, and speaking of the kingdom of God. And while staying with them he charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me, for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit." So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth." And when he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."



13 May 2021 Ascension Day

We have resumed in-person worship, after an hiatus of about four months. We welcome those of you who are with us here today and refer you to the guidelines for gathering safely on the inside front page and to the instructions you will find throughout the leaflet.

Notes on Today's Music: Violin virtuoso Arcangelo Corelli published only a small number of works, which have since served as touchstones of the repertoire for string instruments in the Western Classical Tradition. His *Sonate da chiesa* (Church sonatas) alternate slow and fast movements in imitative polyphony derived from the tradition of Renaissance vocal polyphony.

London-born Sir **Sydney H. Nicholson** founded what has become the Royal School of Church Music, and held posts as organist at many distinguished institutions including Westminster Abbey. His services to Anglican church music also include editing *Hymns Ancient and Modern*, and composing the hymn-tune Crucifer, to which we sing (and to which one day we shall again together sing) the hymn "Lift high the cross."

Heinrich Schütz studied with Giovanni Gabrieli in Venice and served as Court Composer to the Elector of Saxony in Dresden, where drastic cuts in budget during the Thirty Years' War led him to produce a series of masterworks for small forces, such as today's motet for solo voice, strings, and continuo.
